Homework: There will be some homework in health. Any assignments or projects that cannot be finished during class will need to be done at home. Students will also be expected to study for quizzes and tests on their own time.

Make up Work: There may be assignments that cannot be made up if you are absent. If an assignment can be made up, it is your responsibility to collect all class work and homework missed due to an absence. It should be completed and handed in before the unit test.
